

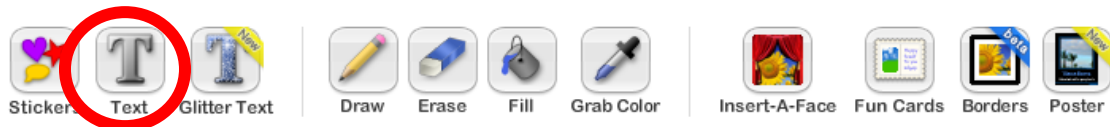
USING FOTOFLEXER TO ATTRIBUTE YOUR IMAGE SOURCE

One very handy use for FotoFlexer is adding text to images – this works well as a way to attribute the source of your Creative Commons (CC) licensed images.

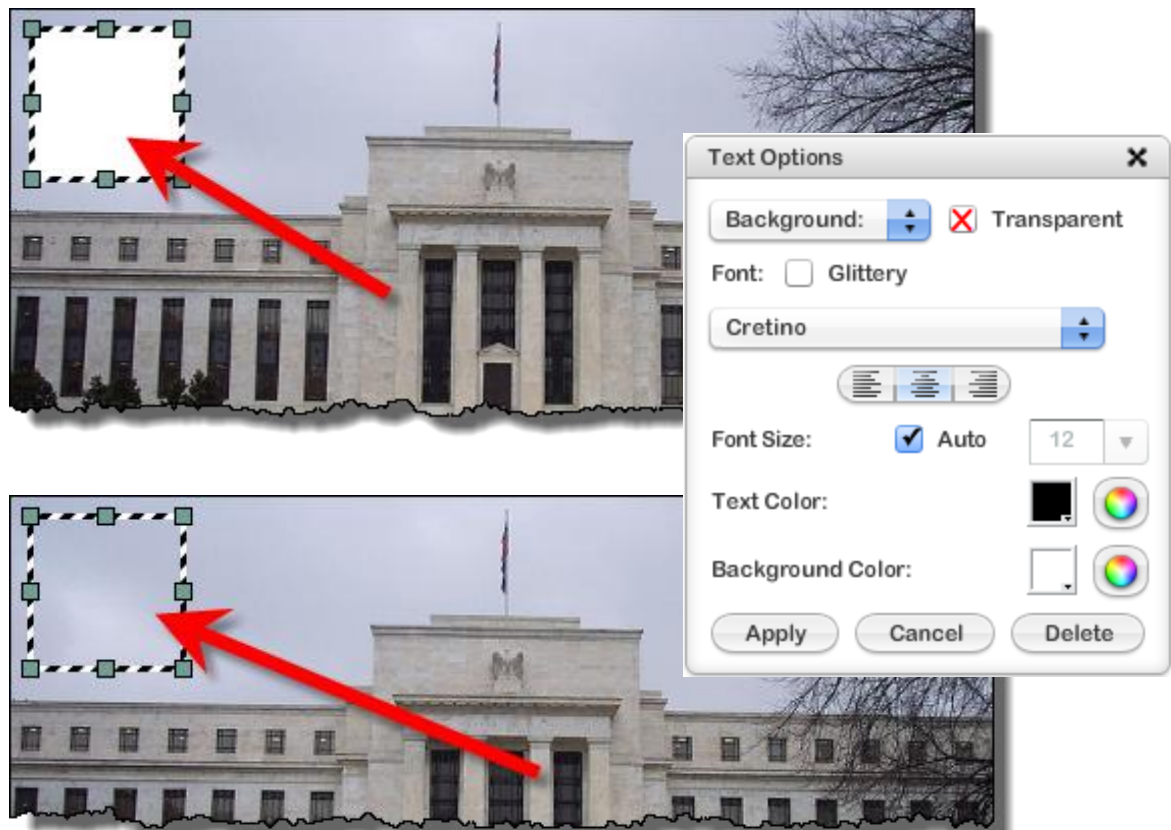
1. Go to <http://fotoflexer.com> and upload the Flickr (CC-licensed) image that you saved earlier. The “Text” feature is under “Decorate,” so you will need to click on that tab.



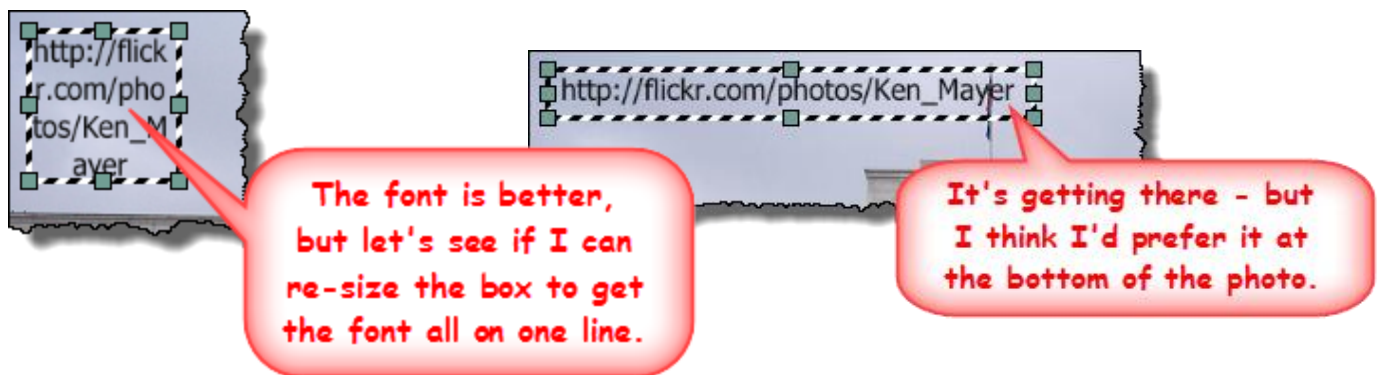
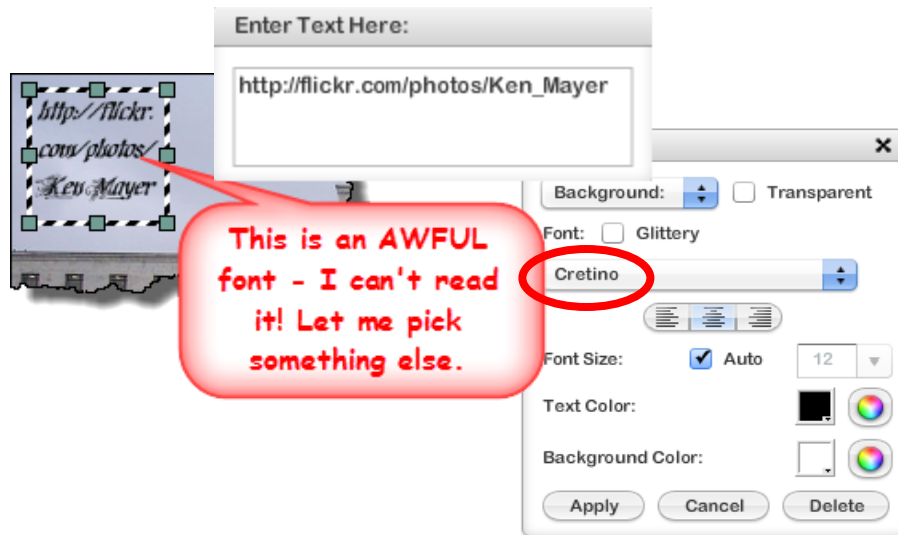
From the “Decorate” menu, choose the “Text” icon:



2. Take a look at the image that you are editing – there is now a textbox on the image. It is moveable and resizable, but at the moment, it is also white, which detracts from my image. In the editing menu to the right of your image, check the “Transparent” box. The text box background is now transparent, and you can enter text without interfering too much with the image:



3. Once you have entered text into the editing box, you can change the size, font, and color of your text by using the editing menu to the right:



Finally – here is the image with the attribution (in the form of a URL to the source) at the bottom. There is no set way to attribute the source on a Creative Commons license; for example, either of these images could be used:
