


The concept behind printwhatyoulike.com is simple – save paper, ink, and money by selecting only those portions of a website that you want to print. Not the ads, or the pages and pages of commentary left by readers. You can choose just the text, or you can print just a photo with an excerpt from an article. Try it!

Here's a Wired Magazine article that I'm interested in using for a class discussion. Look at all of the extras on the website – if I just hit "print," I'd be wasting reams of paper!! Let me try a few changes.


1. Go to <http://printwhatyoulike.com> and enter the URL of the webpage you want to print, then click the "START" button.


Alternatively, you can put the PrintWhatYouLike bookmarklet – <http://www.printwhatyoulike.com/bookmarklet> -- in your browser's toolbar, so that it is handy for use anytime you find a webpage you want to print:



2. Here is the PrintWhatYouLike editing menu:



3. Let me start by removing some of the elements – all I do is highlight an area, the click the “Remove” button.



Once I have removed the unnecessary elements from the top and from the right-hand side of the article, I am able to use the “Resize” feature to stretch the remaining components of the article to fill the space:



Here's how it looks after just a little bit of editing with PrintWhatYouLike – I've probably gone from 15-20 pages to just 2 pages!!
