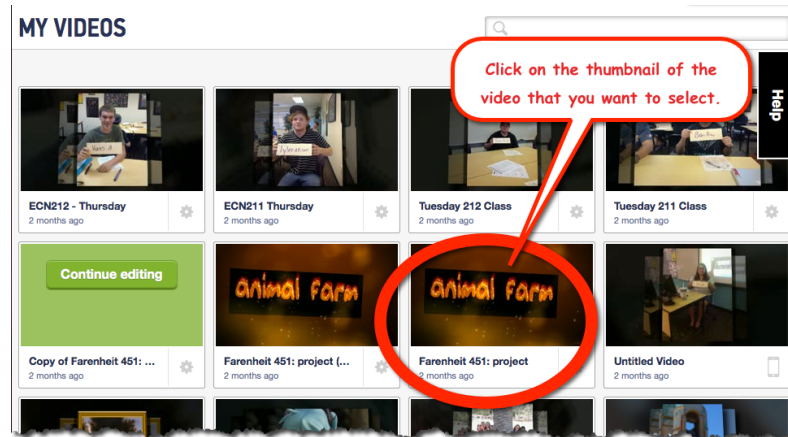


HOW DO I FIND THE EMBED CODE . . . ?

When embedding any type of media or web 2.0 object into Canvas, the magic is in the embed code. Here are a few examples of web-based tools, and where to find the embed code for each – soon, you’ll be scanning for the magic word “embed” all by yourself!

EXAMPLE -- ANIMOTO:

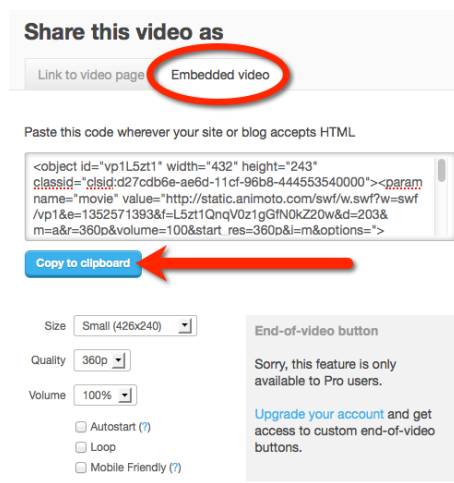
1. Log into your account at <http://animoto.com>, go to “My Videos,” then select the video that you want to embed.



2. To the right of your video, you will see a “Share” menu -- select “More.”



In the “Share this video as” box that pops up, go to the “Embedded video” tab to find the embed code. Now all you need to do is to click the blue “Copy to clipboard” button; then you can return to your Canvas course and paste the embed code in the desired area.



Embed codes for other web-based tools . . . remember, the words to look for are "share" or "embed":

If you don't see the word "embed", just look for the word "share"!

Screenr

It's the magic word -- "embed"!

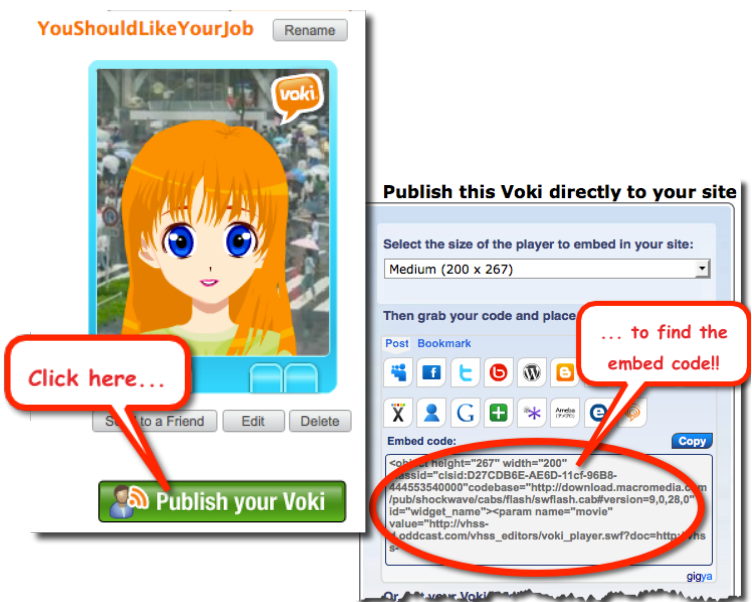
